PUB NEWS

I'm sure many of our residents are now aware that the previously named Norfolk Lurcher (or even Ugly Bug, if you go back that far), has now been re-named. Mark and Rose are doing really well since its first opening, with both the hospitality and Rose's wonderful cooking making it well worth a visit.

A47 DUAL CARRIAGEWAY CONSTRUCTION – AN UPDATE

Following two separate meetings with representatives from National Highways, the first at our most recent Parish Council Meeting, and the second, at the A47/NWL Local Liaison Group (LLG) meeting the following day, we have been updated as to ongoing work at the construction site, and its effect upon roads through Colton and Marlingford.

We have been advised that mitigation is underway to deal with the continuing problem of flooding at the Honingham Roundabout. We understand that National Highways will be installing flood prevention tanks at the site. **However, to do this, we are advised that the A47 will be closed completely overnight on the 12th of April.**

National Highways has now been in conversation with the police regarding putting in additional measures that day, to encourage HGV drivers to use the official diversion route to the A11 and A1075. We have also stressed the need for National Highways to install "Do not use your Satnav" signs whilst the work is being undertaken because, despite the best efforts of the authorities, local drivers and those relying on their in-car equipment will continue to use our villages as a rat run.

National Highways is hopeful that the experience they will gain from these necessary mitigation methods, and their ongoing discussions with the police about future planned and emergency closures of the A47, will help them to reduce as much as possible, the knock-on effect of traffic through the Parish.

National Highways has also given us an update following the rejection of Andrew Boswell's appeal, in the Appeals Court. Work will now go ahead in earnest with the construction phase of the A47 between East Tuddenham and Easton. However, the project is now running behind schedule because necessary activities such as hedge clearing, and its effect on the nesting bird population, will be delayed from the earlier construction timetable planned for wintertime.

Finally, we would confirm that we are continuing to press South Norfolk Council for a timetable to re-instate verges throughout the parish. Sadly, no such information has been forthcoming, and so we will re-activate this in early April, once their new financial year's budgets are in place, and they should have the necessary funding in place to start the hoped-for remedial works.

THE COLTON MILLENIUM YEW (AGAIN)

Following the previous article on this subject, we are delighted to confirm that, through the good auspices of our Councillor, Debbie Perfect, we are advised that her parents, who live in Burston, have been given approval by their own Parish Council, to take a cutting from their yew tree, which had been planted as part of their own millennium commemorations, which will be grown on, and given to Colton, to replace our own tree.

We are hoping to finalize arrangements as to where the replacement will be planted and will let you have an update in our next edition of this Newsletter.

MARLINGFORD BUGLE

Following on from the success of the **Village People** WhatsApp group in Colton, which has now reached almost 50 people, Marlingford residents have now formed their own similar WhatsApp group called the Marlingford Bugle. DEFIBRILLATORS

The Parish is fortunate that it has 2 fully functioning defibrillators, one outside Colton Village Hall and one on the front wall of the Bell in Marlingford. These devices are checked monthly and maintained by the Parish Council. In the event of an emergency and 999 is called the ambulance dispatcher can give the caller a code to open the cabinet and release the machine. Also in the cabinet is a kit including scissors and a razor.

When the machine is deployed, it talks the user through how to use it and will only issue a shock if needed. Early life support using a defibrillator can save lives.

PARISH PRECEPT 24/25.

The Parish Council precept for 2024/25 has been set at £12,140. This is an increase of 11.37% from last year which equates to an extra 15p a week for a band D property. The Parish Council is very mindful to keep increases to a minimum where possible. The Parish Council has allocated 2 grants to the village halls for £250 each. Audit fees have also risen due to the increased complexity of auditing parish council accounts. Accounts must be audited annually, and paperwork lodged with the external auditor to ensure adherence to transparency codes. Additional money has also been earmarked for Councillor training. It is hoped that the Parish Council will be able to recruit 3 new Councillors this year to fill the current vacancies and offer them the appropriate training. £500 has also been allocated for ensuring that the Defibrillators are kept in working order with "in date" pads and batteries.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INCLUSION

Parish Council Meetings are usually held on the second Tuesday of alternate months at 7pm.

The Annual Parish Meeting is being held on Tuesday 14th May from 7pm at Colton Village Hall. Come and find out about what has been happening in the villages over the last 12 months. Enjoy light refreshments whilst meeting others from the villages.

At each meeting there is an opportunity for members of the public to speak and raise any issues they may have. You are also welcome to simply come along and listen to the meeting. Councillors look forward to welcoming residents to the next meeting.
